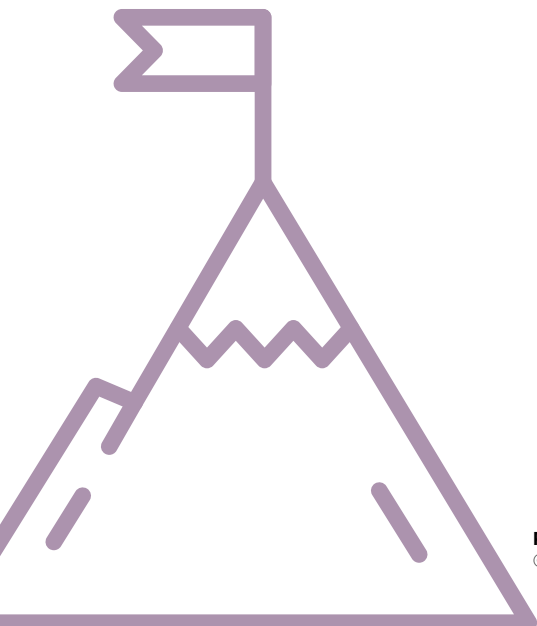
Sample Behaviors
